#### **EJACULATIONS AND INVOCATIONS**

1

To the King of ages, immortal and invisible, the only God, be honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen (Roman Breviary).

An indulgence of 500 days.

A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions, if this ejaculation is recited devoutly every day for a month (S. P. Ap., June 7, 1921 and Dec. 9, 1932).

Regi sæculórum immortáli et invisíbili, soli Deo honor et glória in sæcula sæculórum. Amen (ex Breviario Romano).

Holy, Holy Lord God of Hosts: the heavens and the earth are full of Thy glory (Roman Missal).

An indulgence of 500 days.

A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions, if this ejaculation is devoutly recited every day for a month (S. C. Ind., June 6, 1769 and June 26, 1770; S. P. Ap., March 23, 1936 and May 25, 1949).

Sanctus, Sanctus Dóminus Deus Sábaoth: pleni sunt cæli et terra glória tua (ex Missali Romano).

ith all our heart and voice, we acknowledge, we praise and we bless Thee, God the Father unbegotten, Thee, the only-begotten Son, Thee, the Holy Ghost the Paraclete, O holy and undivided Trinity (Roman Missal).

An indulgence of 500 days.

A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions, when this prayer is devoutly repeated every day for a month (S. C. Ind., July 2, 1816; S. P. Ap., Sept. 28, 1936).

Te Deum Patrem ingénitum, te Fílium unigénitum, te Spíritum Sanctum Paráclitum, sanctam et indivíduam Trinitátem, toto corde et ore confitémur, laudámus atque benedícimus (ex Missali Romano).

ay the most just, the most high and the most lovable will of God be in all things done, praised and evermore exalted.

An indulgence of 500 days.

A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions, if the daily devout recitation of this ejaculation is continued for a month.

A plenary indulgence at the hour of death, to be gained by those who have often recited it during life and who, after confession and Communion or at least an act of contrition, shall invoke the Name of Jesus, orally if possible, or at least in their heart, and accept death from the hand of the Lord with resignation as being the wages of sin (S. C. Ind., May 19, 1818; S. P. Ap., Dec. 9, 1932).

An indulgence of 300 days (S. C. Ind., March 15, 1890; S. P. Ap., March 23, 1936).

### y God, my only Good, Thou art all mine; may I be always Thine.

An indulgence of 300 days.

A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions, if this invocation is said daily for a month with pious dispositions (Apostolic Brief, March 13, 1902, exhib. March 17, 1902)

### Blessed be the Name of the Lord!

An indulgence of 500 days, as often as this ejaculation is devoutly recited upon hearing blasphemies against God (S. C. Ind., Nov. 28, 1903; S. P. Ap., Dec. 9, 1932).

Sit Nomen Dómini benedíctum!

# y God, I give Thee thanks for what Thou givest, and for what Thou takest away; Thy will be done.

An indulgence of 300 days (Pius X, Rescript in his own hand, May 29, 1906, exhib. June 28, 1922; S. P. Ap., May 22, 1934).

### y God, make us to be of one mind in the truth and of one heart in charity.

An indulgence of 300 days (Pius X, Rescript in his own hand, May 16, 1908, exhib. May 30, 1908).

## Teach me, O Lord, to do Thy will, for Thou art my God (Psalm 142, 10).

An indulgence of 500 days.

A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions, when the daily recitation of this invocation is continued for a month (S. P. Ap., Jan. 20, 1921 and Oct. 4, 1933).

Doce me, Dómine, fácere voluntátem tuam, quia Deus meus es Tu (Ps. CXLII, 10).

- a) Most Holy Trinity, I adore Thee who art dwelling by Thy grace within my soul.
- b) O Most Holy Trinity, who art dwelling by Thy grace within my soul, make me love Thee more and more.
- c) O Most Holy Trinity, who art dwelling by Thy grace within my soul, sanctify me more and more.
- d) Abide with me, O Lord, be Thou my true joy.

An indulgence of 500 days (Apostolic Brief, Jan. 26, 1924; S. P. Ap., Feb. 12, 1934).

- b) To Thee be praise, to Thee be glory, to Thee be thanksgiving through endless ages, O Blessed Trinity (Roman Missal).

An indulgence of 500 days for each invocation even when recited separately.

A plenary indulgence on the usual conditions, if either ejaculation is recited daily with devotion for an entire month (Apostolic Brief, Feb. 13, 1924; S. P. Ap., Dec. 9, 1932).

- a) Sanctus Deus, Sanctus fortis, Sanctus immortális, miserére nobis.
- b) Tibi laus, tibi glória, tibi gratiárum áctio in sæcula sempitérna, o beáta Trínitas (ex Missali Romano).
